

Configuring Register Domain Order Module

When the module runs, any domain names in the order are automatically registered with your appropriate TLD configured registrar.

Setting Up the Order Action

1. In the **Domain Name** field, enter the name of the domain. You can enter a particular domain name, such as ubersmith.com, or leave it blank to register the domain specified in the **Server /Domain** (packX[server]) field in an order form, where X is the service index such as pack1 for service1. For example, `<input id="pack1[server]" name="pack1[server]" type="text" value="" />`. The packX[server] field is included in the [Order Form Wizard](#).
2. In the **Registration Period in Years** field, enter the number of years you want to register for.
3. In the **Attempt Transfer if Domain is Registered** field, select **Yes** if you want to try to register the domain when it is already registered.
