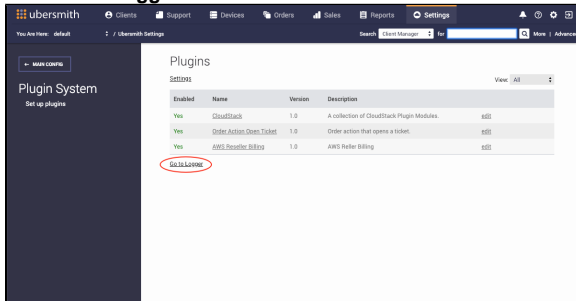


# Managing the Plugin Logger

Once you have enabled the *Plugin Logger*, you can view its results and filter the content.

## Viewing the Plugin Logger

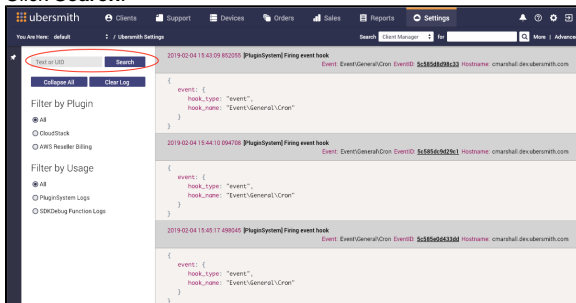
1. Access the *Plugins* page.
2. Click **Go to Logger**.



The *Plugin Logger* appears.

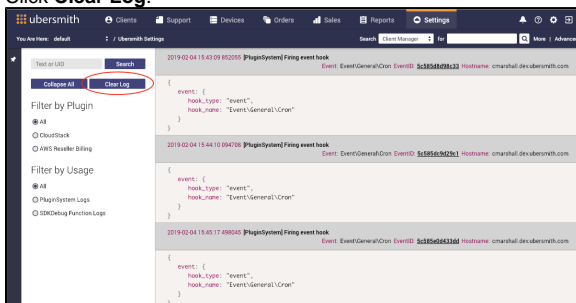
## Searching the Plugin Logger

1. Access the *Plugin Logger*.
2. In the **Text** or **UID** field, enter the criteria you need to find.
3. Click **Search**.



## Clearing the Plugin Logger

1. Access the *Plugin Logger*.
2. Click **Clear Log**.



## Filter the Plugin Logger

You can filter login information by a specific enabled and configured plugin or by usage.

### Filtering by Plugin

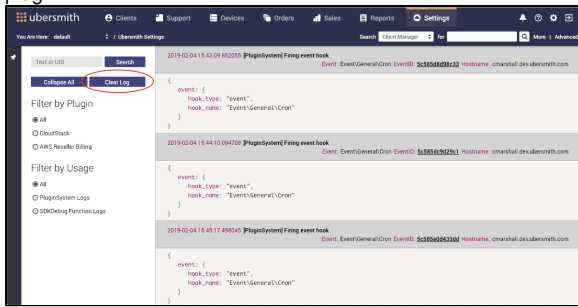
1. Access the *Plugin Logger*.

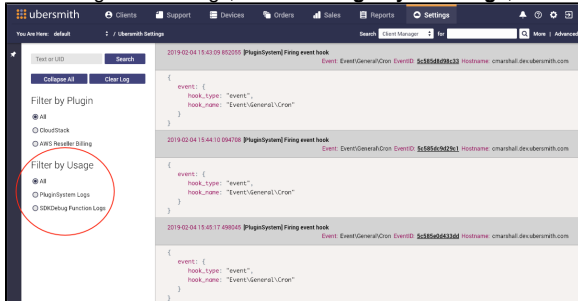
